The month of April we celebrate the core value of patience. Blessed are the gentle for they shall possess the earth. Matt. 5:5

In a world where we are frequently confronted with frustrations and waiting, the Core Value of Patience teaches us to practice moments of acceptance, pause and endurance. What is it that we do when we are waiting – waiting in line, in traffic, at the drinking fountain, on the phone or internet? Our daily challenge is to use that time to become closer to God, to those around us, and to the beauty of the world. We need to consider as well, that our lives consist of a series of moments of waiting - waiting for our Eternal Life. At Nazareth School, learning about and practicing patience challenges us to live a life of waiting moments to become closer to God and one another.

At sundown, we prepare for the Easter Triduum of the passion and resurrection of Christ. It marks the height of the entire liturgical year. The Tridium is the liturgical season that follows Lent, precedes the Easter season and is the period of three days. It begins with the liturgy on the evening of Holy Thursday, reaches its high point in the Easter Vigil, and closes with evening prayer on Easter Sunday. During this time, we celebrate the Paschal Mystery which is the passion, death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ and is the culmination of the work that God the Father sent His Son to accomplish on earth.
