Drop-off and Pick-up Line

Thank you for your patience, grace and cooperation in the drop-off and pick-up lines. In the mornings, we respectfully request you do not wait in the drop-off lane before school begins, it is for loading and unloading of students only. If you do not wish your child to go to morning extended care before 7:45 am, please park in a designated parking spot. At the end of the school day, we have a 2:40pm bell that rings to remind teachers to be out on time. Dismissal of students begins promptly at 2:45pm every day, and 11:55am on minimum days.

During pick-up, we request that do not use the Rancho Mission entrance, as traffic backs up creating a dangerous hazard. For safety, please have your children enter and exit your cars from the right side only. It is extremely scary when children and parents, dart in and out of traffic as cars drive by, please help up keep our community safe.
