The meeting began with a quick 20-minute introduction and PTG update, followed by a wonderful presentation by Jodee Blanco, on inclusivity, hospitality and digital citizenship. Her presentation was in response to many parents request for assistance to addressing the social and emotional effects of the past few years on students. In my Principal's Update, I discussed the creation of updated Schoolwide Learning Expectations (SLEs): Students will practice their faith through prayer, reflection, active participation in the Liturgy and service to others. Students will achieve academic excellence by using creativity, critical thinking and problem-solving skills to demonstrate competency in all subjects. Students will practice the ethical use and integration of technology to support learning. Students will take responsibility for their actions and know choices have consequences. Students will practice and model the Core Values of the Sisters of Nazareth. Each lesson taught is connected to the Schoolwide Learning Expectations.


As you know, this year the faculty has been hard at work preparing for Nazareth Schools' upcoming accreditation process by the Western Catholic Educational Association (WCEA) and The Accrediting Commission for Schools, Western Association of Schools and Colleges (ACS WASC). Both are Catholic accreditation agencies who inspire excellence in Catholic education. WCEA's mission is to advance quality Catholic education for all students in member schools and arch/dioceses through an accrediting process that promotes the primacy of faith formation, the rigor of educational excellence, and the vitality that comes through continuous school improvement. ACS WASC advances and validates quality ongoing school improvement by supporting its private and public elementary, secondary and postsecondary member institutions to engage in a rigorous and relevant self-evaluation and peer review process that focuses on student learning. The faculty has been working diligently on our accreditation document and have identified five critical goals:

- To fully incorporate the new San Diego and Imperial Valley Catholic Schools Religion Prioritized Standards
- To integrate the Schoolwide Learning Expectations (SLEs) into all aspects of physical and spiritual student life
- To adopt and implement the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) for kindergarten through eighth grade
- To implement the Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS)
- To utilize the ACRE data to improve the Catholic identity for the high achievement of all students

We are excited to announce that we have received our official accreditation dates for WCEA/ACS WASC. The visitation team will be visiting Nazareth School on Wednesday, February 8 through Friday, February, 10th.

As Fall continues, we know that the flu and cold season is upon us all in San Diego and we ask that you continue to help keep our Nazareth community safe by following the health guidance of keeping all of your children home if one child if affected by one of the COVID-19 symptoms of fever, cough, shortness of breath, nasal congestion, sore throat, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, fatigue, new loss of taste or smell, headache, muscle or body aches, poor feeding, poor appetite, or knowledge of close contact with a person who is lab confirmed to have COVID-19. Please keep your child home if they have the flu or a cold with a fever. If you are interested, the annual flu shot is now available in San Diego, please contact your child's doctor for more details.

Please contact the Nazareth School office 619-641-7987 or office@nazarethschool.org, if your child is experiencing any Covid-19 symptoms. According to the HHSA, any person with these symptoms must remain home for a minimum of 24 hours. Students may return to Nazareth School, after 24 hours, with a negative PCR Covid test, symptoms resolving, no fever and no use of medication.
